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1 Sign in

Sign in so all your progress is saved.

- 1 Open TanoshiGo, then click the profile icon at the top right, or the Sign in button.
- 2 Choose Google or Discord for a quick sign in, or fill in your Email and Password.
- 3 Click Sign in. You are taken to the home page.

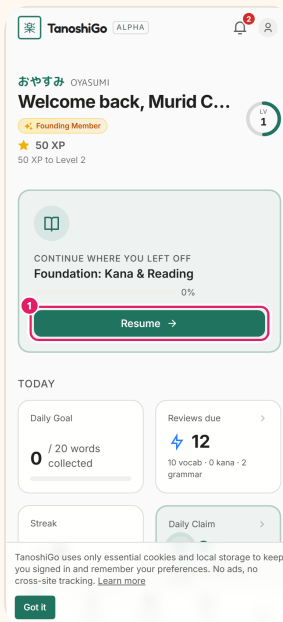
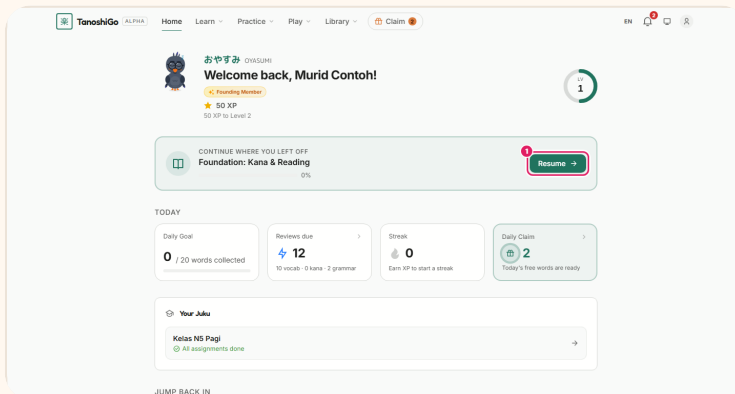

On the sign-in page, tick the age and terms checkbox before the sign-in buttons become active.

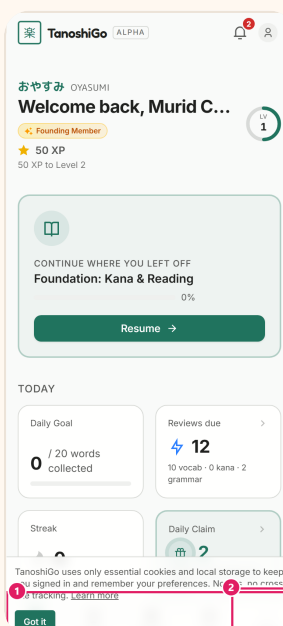
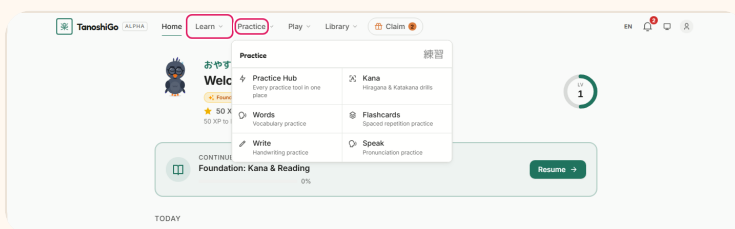
2 Home and navigation

After you sign in, the home page shows what to continue and a summary of today.

- 1 The Resume card takes you back to your last lesson. Click Resume.
- 2 The Today strip shows your goal, reviews due, streak, and Daily Claim.
- 3 The top menu groups features: Learn, Practice, Play, Library, and Claim.



The home page with the Resume card and Today summary.

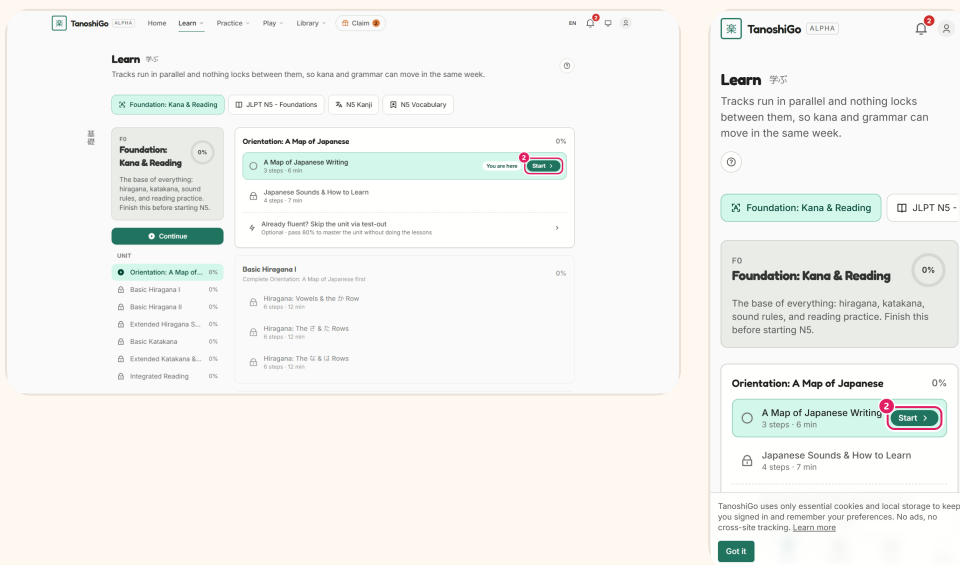

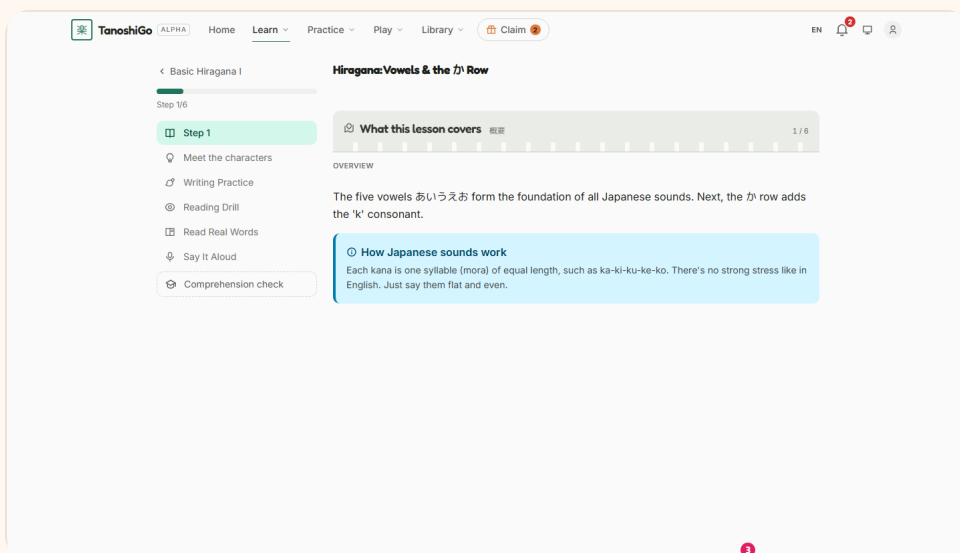
3 Doing a lesson

A lesson guides you one step at a time.

- 1 Open Learn then Lessons, or click Resume on the home page.
- 2 Pick a track in the top row, then pick a lesson (Start or Resume).
- 3 Read each block. Tap the speaker icon to hear the Japanese, then click Continue.
- 4 On the last step, click Finish. You can add the vocabulary to your reviews.



The Learn page with the track picker and lesson list.



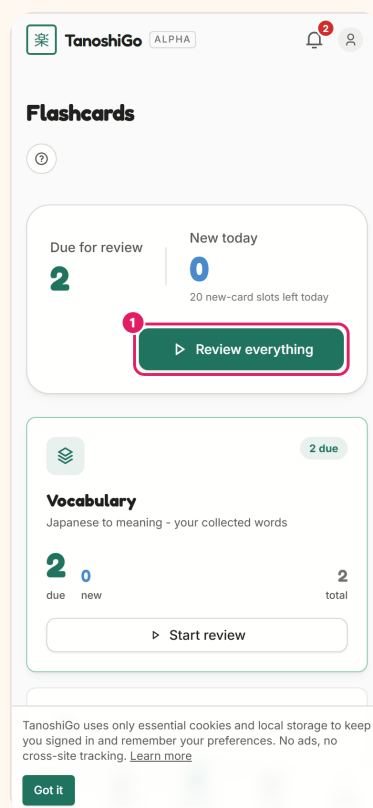
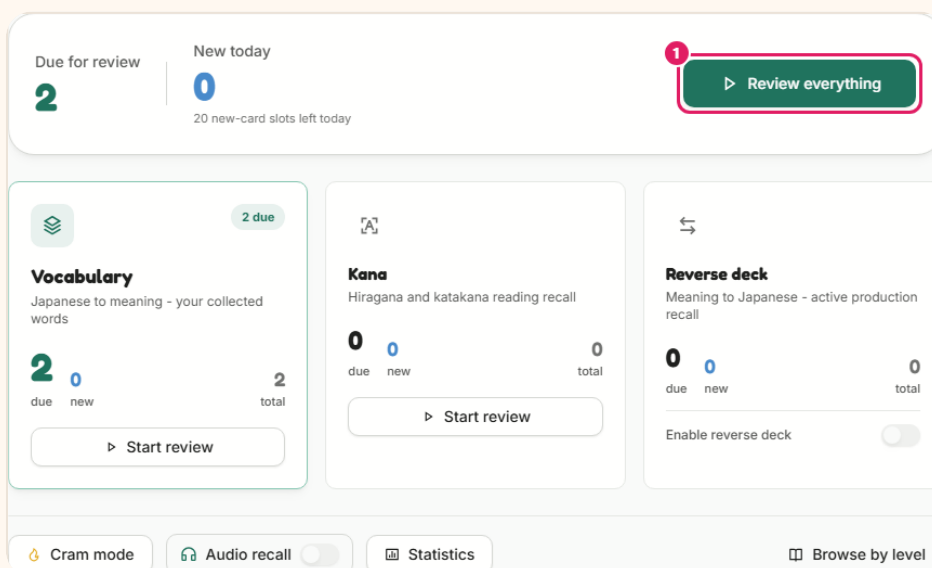

Reviewing with flashcards

Flashcards bring a word back right before you would forget it.

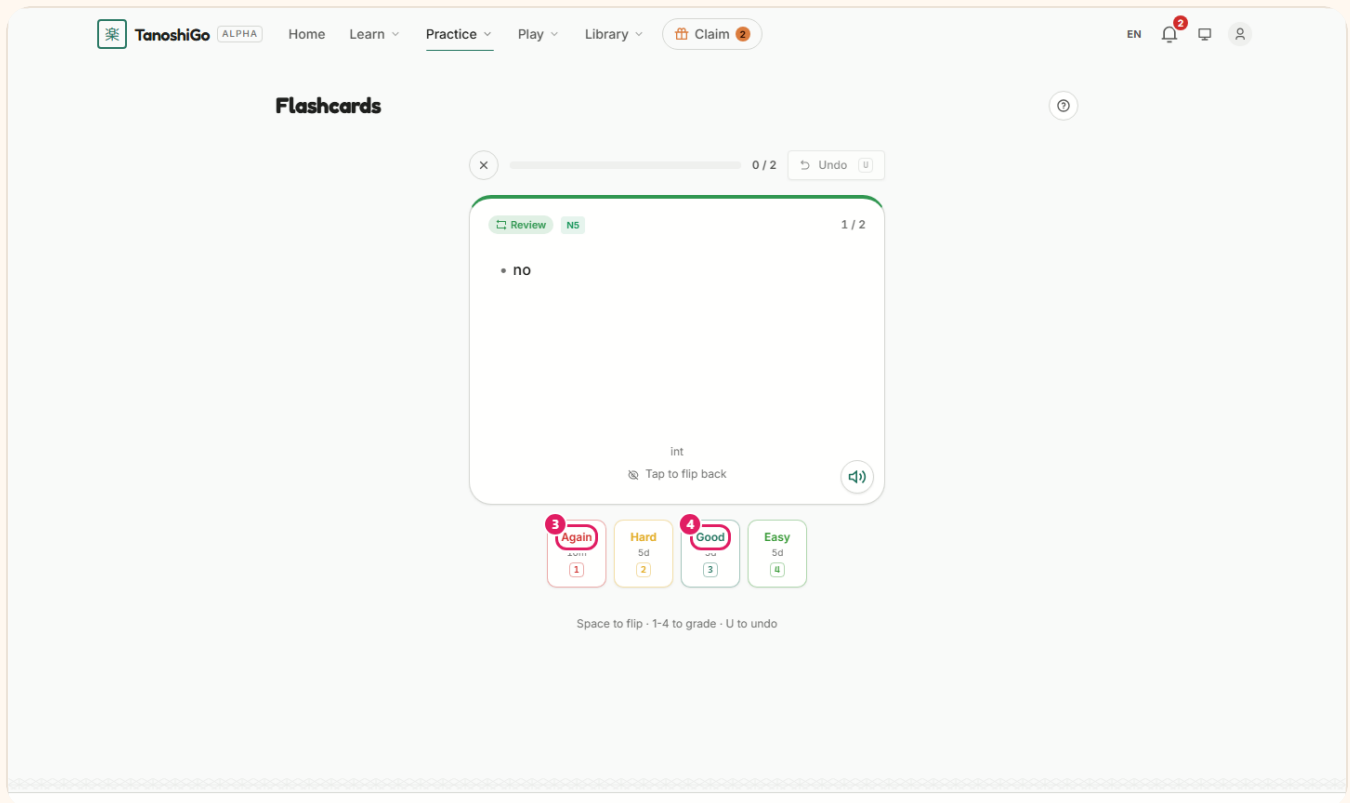
- 1 Open Practice then Flashcards. Click Review everything, or Start review on one deck.
- 2 Look at the card, then flip it by tapping the card or pressing Space.
- 3 Grade your recall: Again, Hard, Good, or Easy.
- 4 Graded it wrong? Click Undo (or press U) to redo it.

Kana practice

Drill hiragana and katakana in several modes.

- 1 Open Practice then Kana. Choose Hiragana, Katakana, or Both.
- 2 Pick characters in the grid (or + Basic for a group), then pick a Practice Mode.
- 3 Click Start Practice to begin.

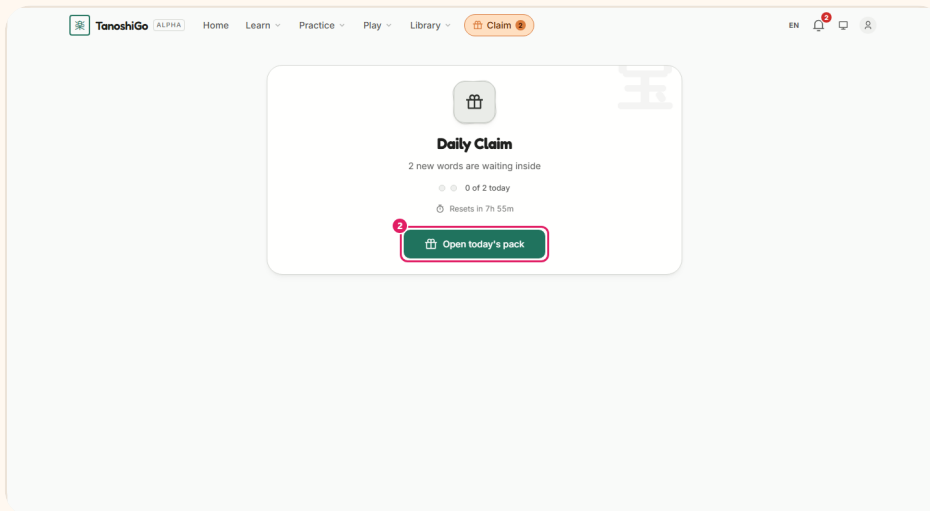

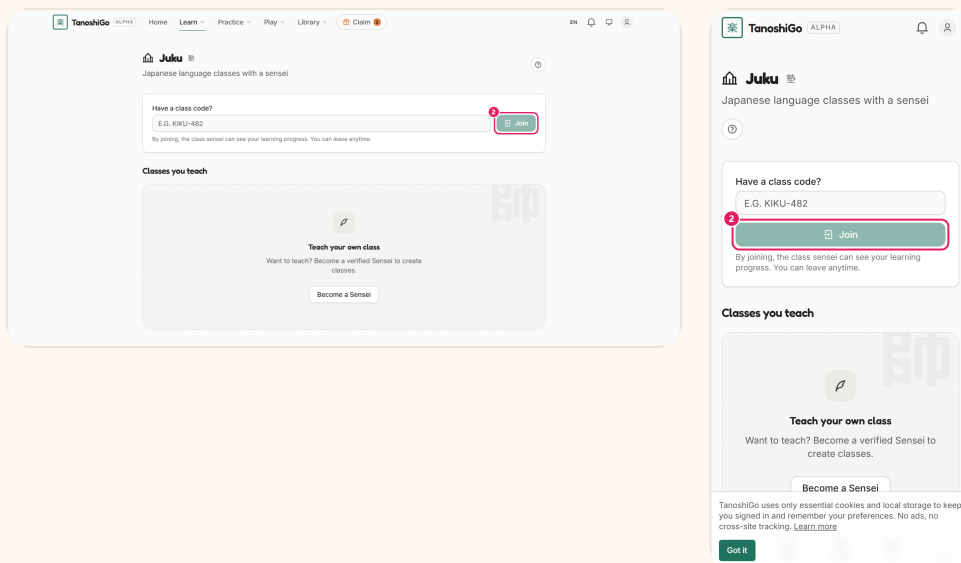

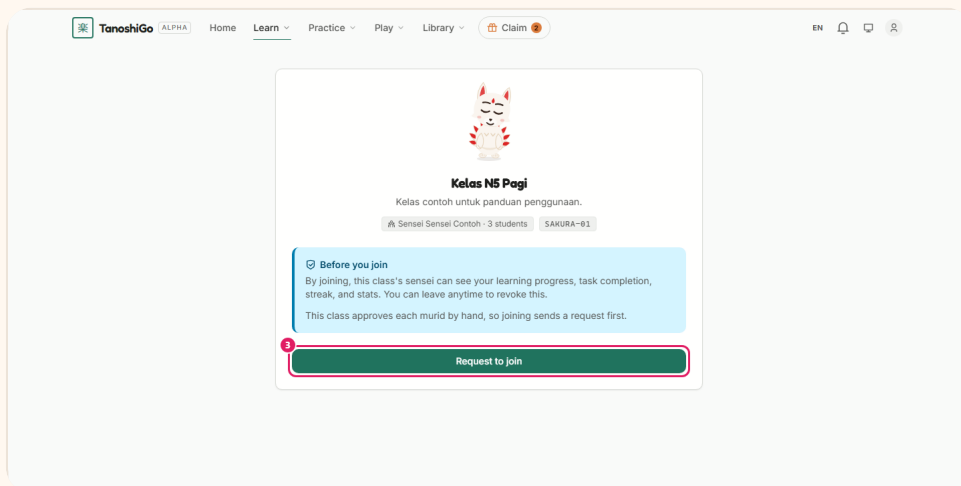
9 Joining a class

If your teacher gave you a class code, you can join their Juku.

- 1 Open Learn then Juku. Enter the code in the Have a class code field.
- 2 Click Join. Or open the invite link your teacher shared.
- 3 Read Before you join, then click Join class (or Request to join).

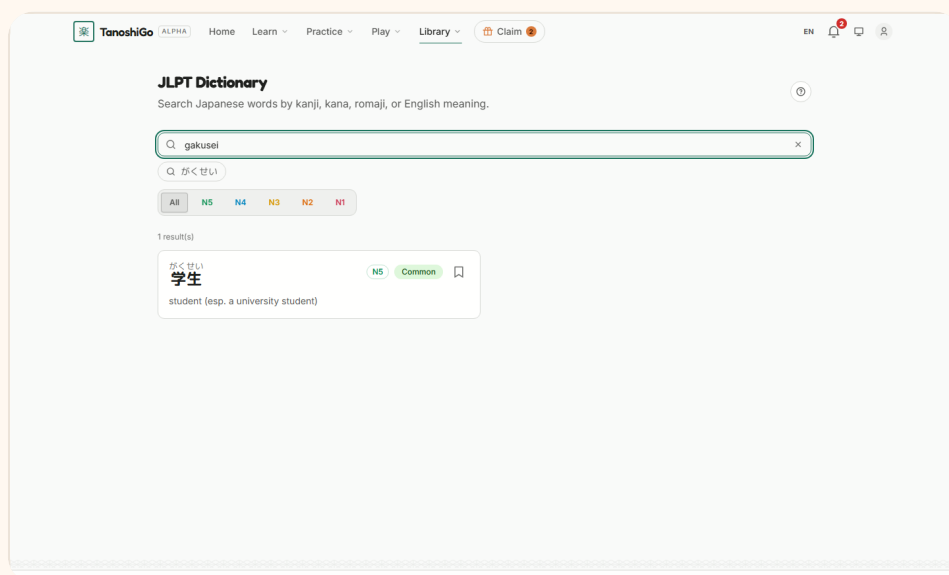
One class at a time

You can be in one class at a time. Your sensei sees your class progress, not your private settings, and you can leave anytime.

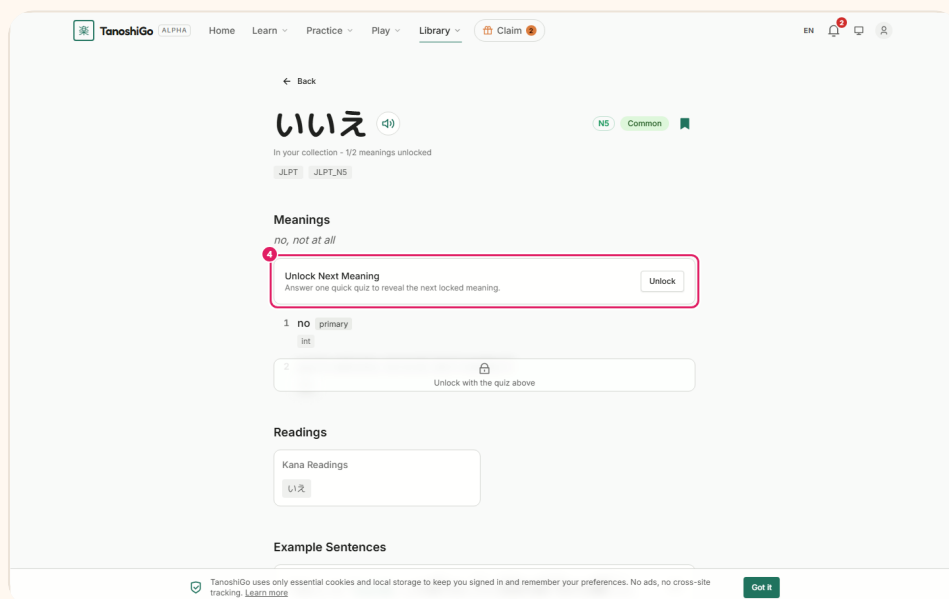
10 Looking up a word

The dictionary is the fastest way to check any word, then save it for review.

- 1 Open Library then Dictionary. Type a word in Japanese, romaji, or English.
- 2 Click a result to open the word page. Tap the speaker icon to hear it.
- 3 Click Collect to add the word to your flashcard deck.
- 4 Scroll to Meanings. Locked meanings show an unlock quiz, answer it to reveal them.

11 Your collection

Every word you have collected lives here, with its review progress.

- 1 Open Library then Collection to see your stats: total words, due, mastered, and leeches.
- 2 Filter by level or SRS stage, or search for a specific word.
- 3 Open the kebab menu on a card to remove, reset, or reactivate it.

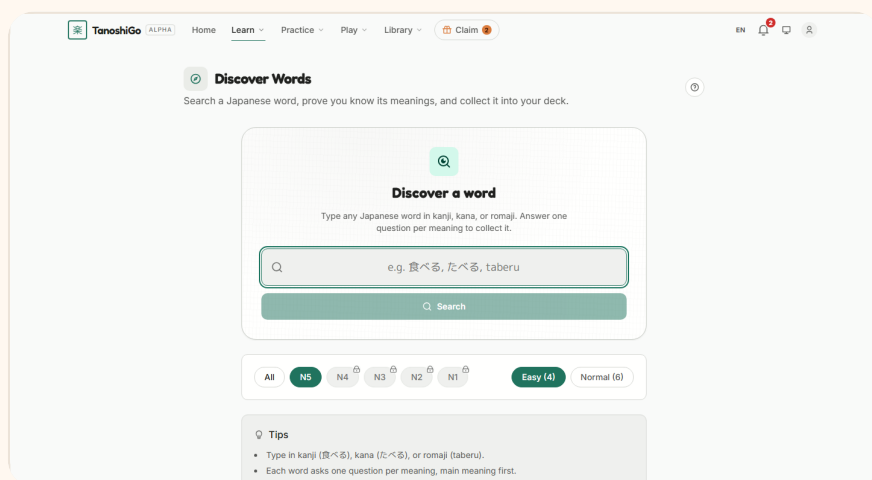

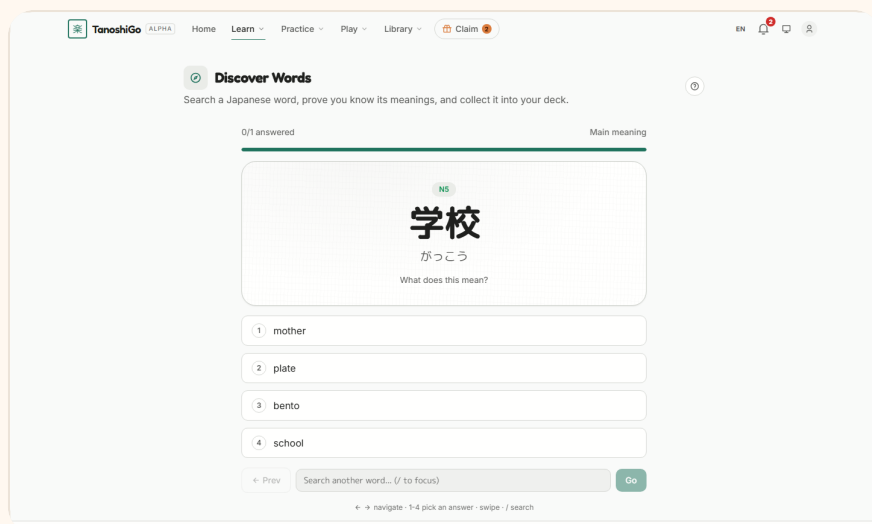
12 Discovery

Search any word and answer challenges about its meanings to collect it.

- 1 Open Practice then Discovery. Pick a level and Easy or Normal difficulty.
- 2 Type a word, in Japanese or romaji, and press Enter.
- 3 Answer the challenge for each meaning. A correct answer collects the word.
- 4 Keep searching more words, or click Finish to see your session results.

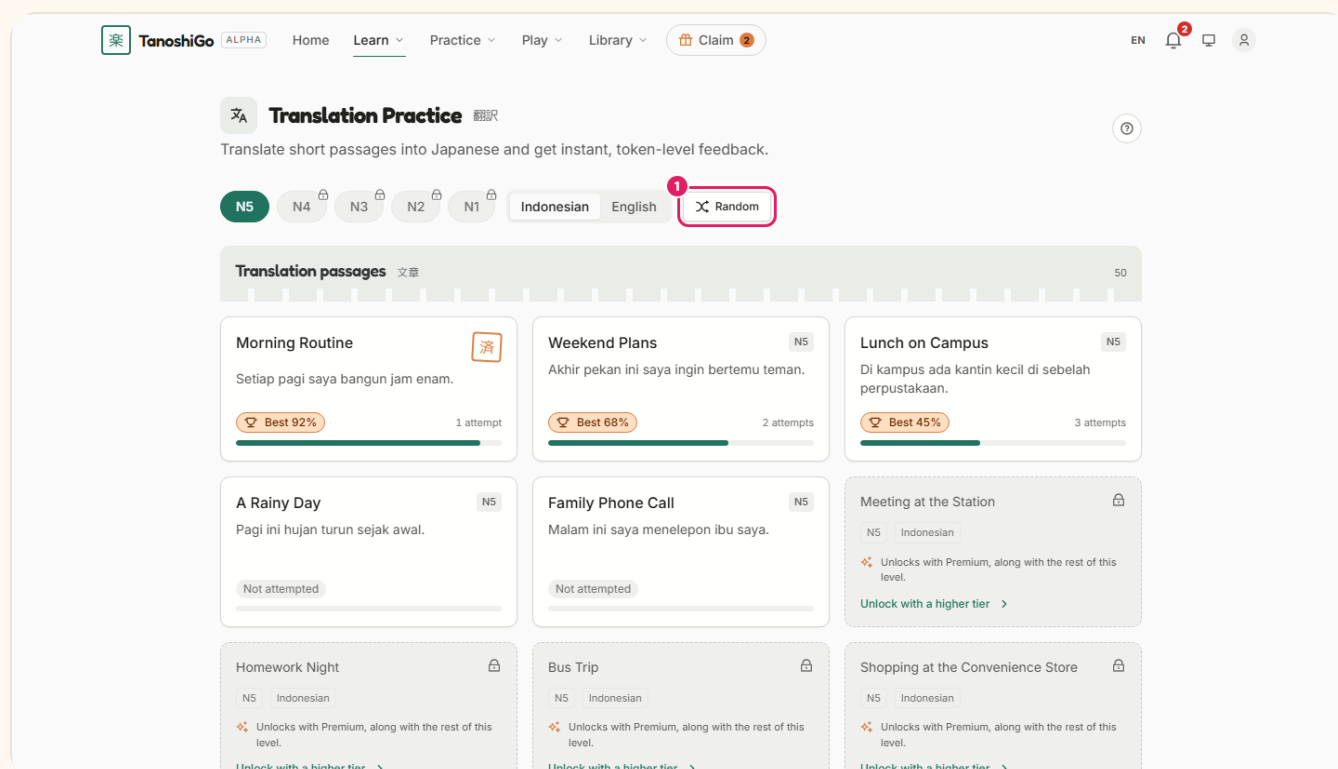
Guests and free accounts

13 Translate

Practice translating short passages between Indonesian or English and Japanese.

- 1 Open Practice then Translate. Pick a level and a source language, then pick a passage or click Random.
- 2 Type your Japanese translation in the editor.
- 3 Click Check to see your score and a breakdown of your answer.
- 4 Click Reveal if you want to see the reference translation.

Once you reveal the reference for a passage, you can no longer earn new best-score XP on it. Try your best first.

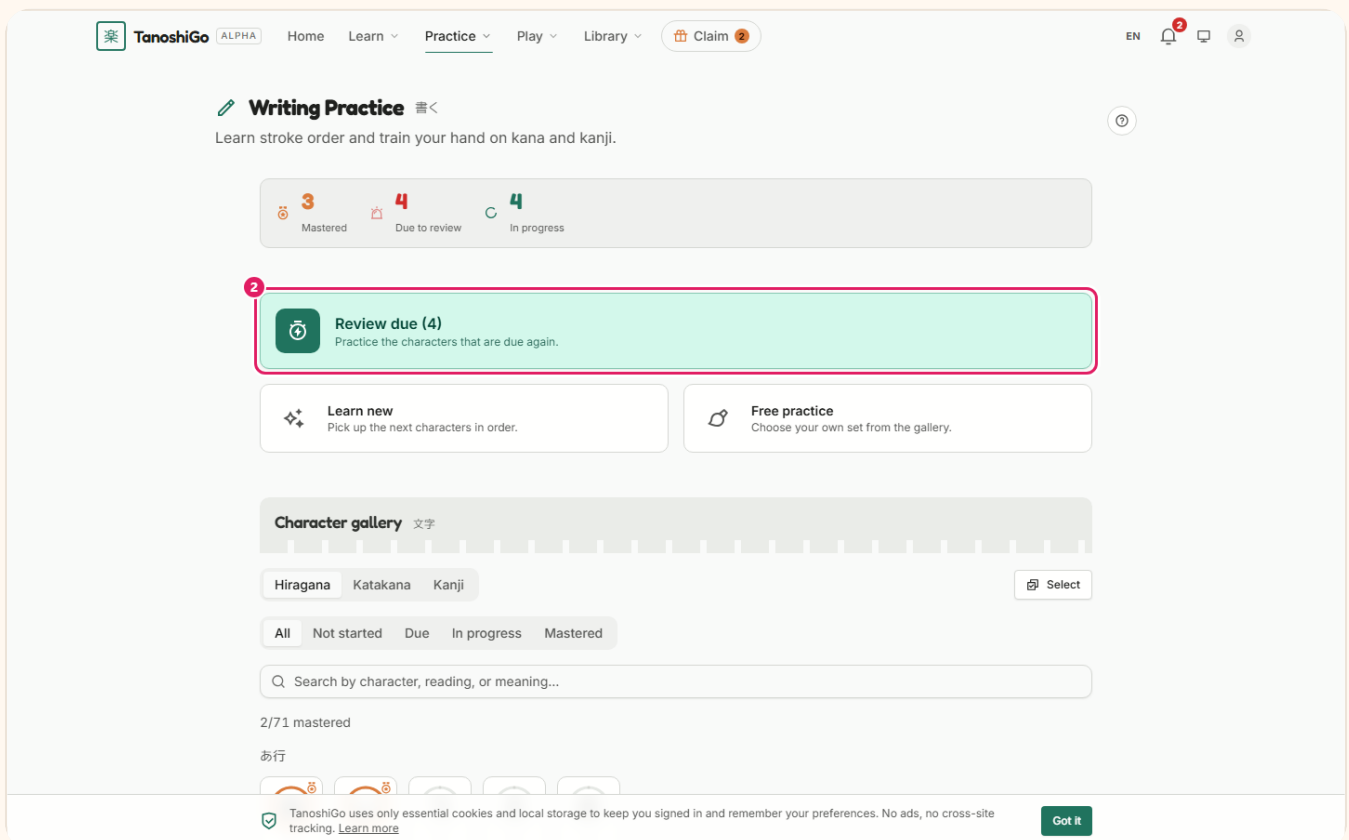

14 Writing practice

Trace hiragana, katakana, and kanji stroke by stroke.

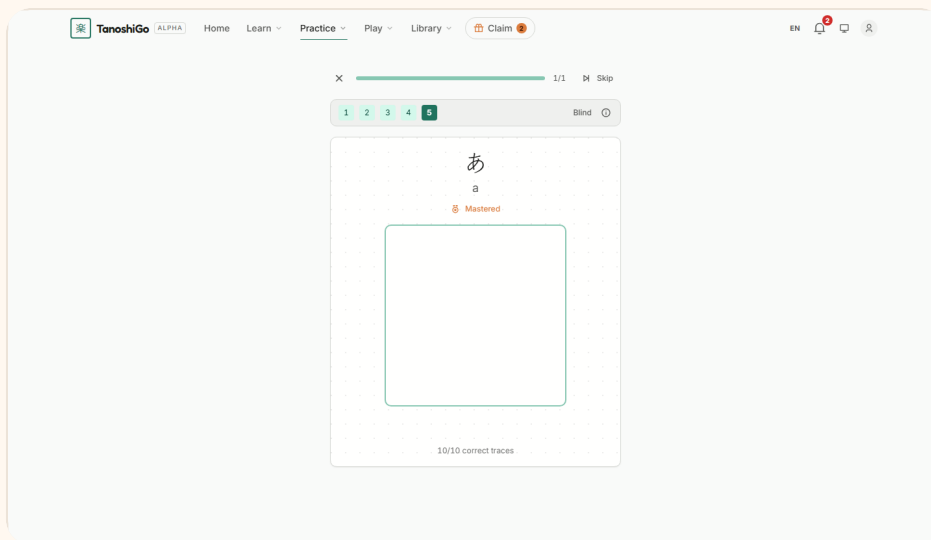
- 1 Open Practice then Write. The hub shows your due, in-progress, and mastered characters.
- 2 Click Review due, Learn new, or pick a character from the gallery.
- 3 Trace each stroke. The app grades your accuracy and shows the stroke order if you need help.
- 4 Finish the set to see your results and any XP earned.

Hiragana and katakana are free for everyone. Kanji follows your level, and free accounts have a limit on new kanji.

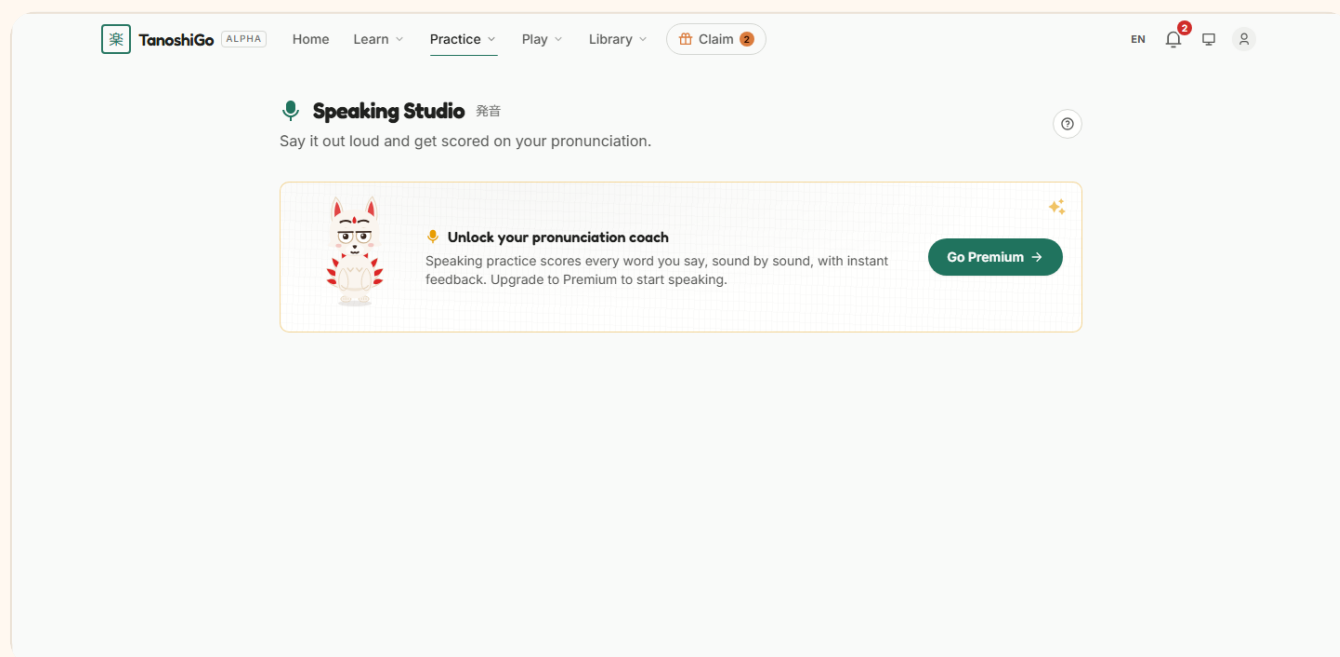

15 Pronunciation practice

Record yourself and get scored on your Japanese pronunciation.

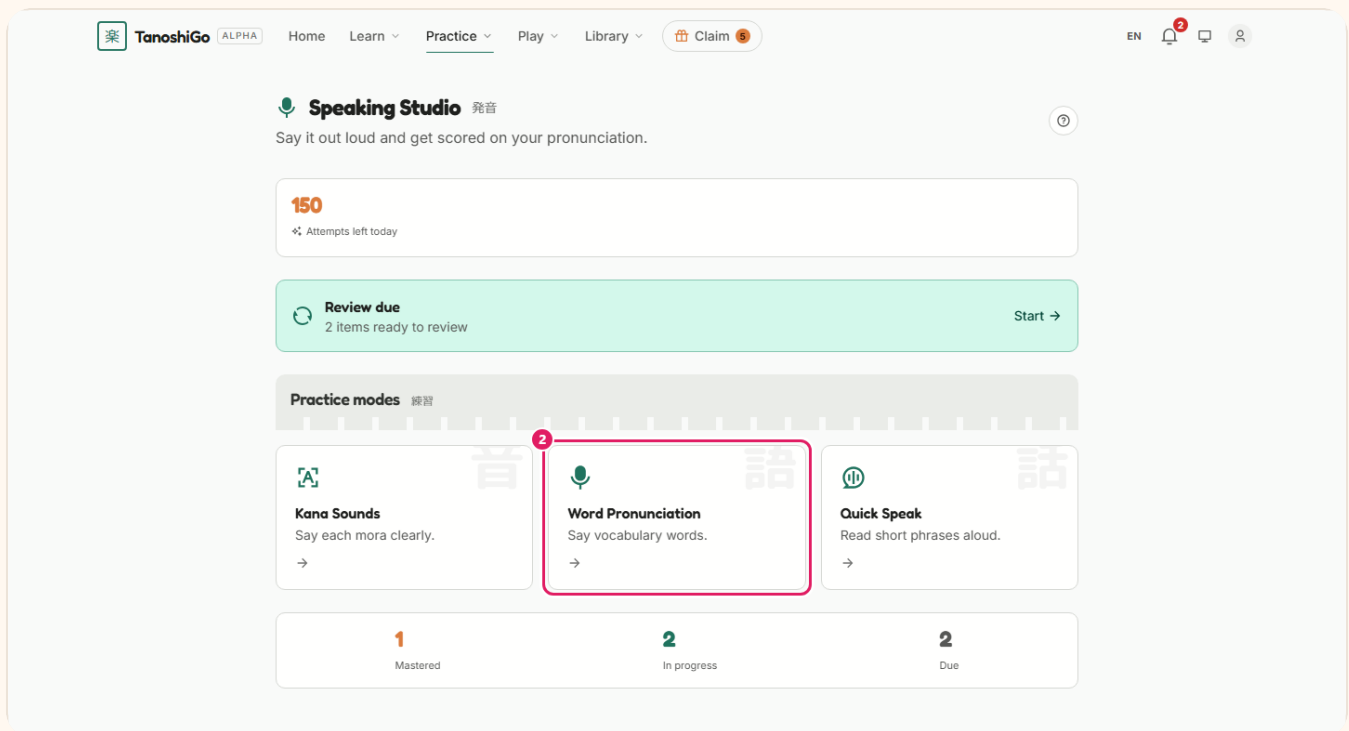
- 1 Open Practice then Speak.
- 2 Pick a mode: Kana Sounds, Word Pronunciation, or Quick Speak.
- 3 Tap the mic, say the phrase, then stop recording.
- 4 See your accuracy score and which sounds to work on, then try again or move on.



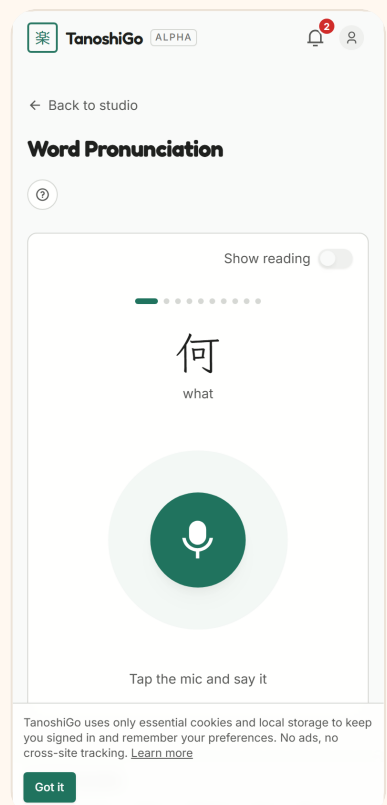
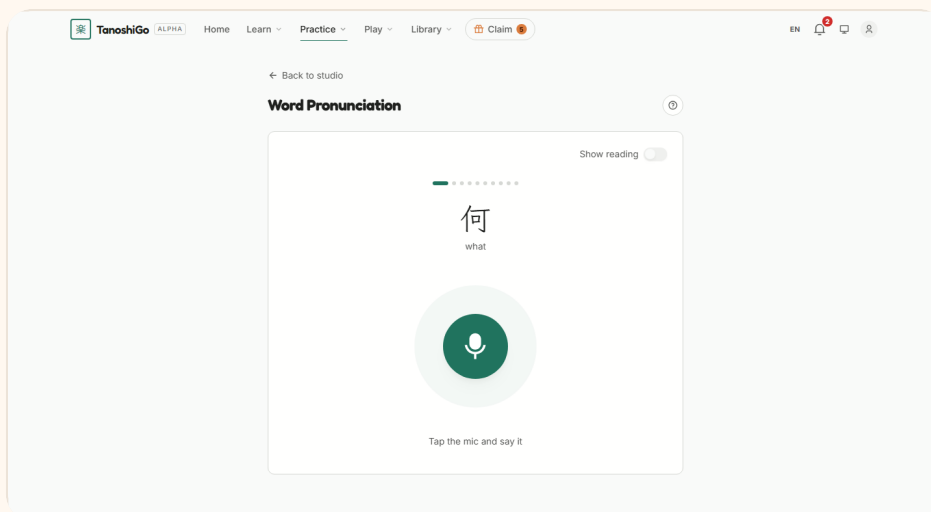

The Speak hub for a Premium account.

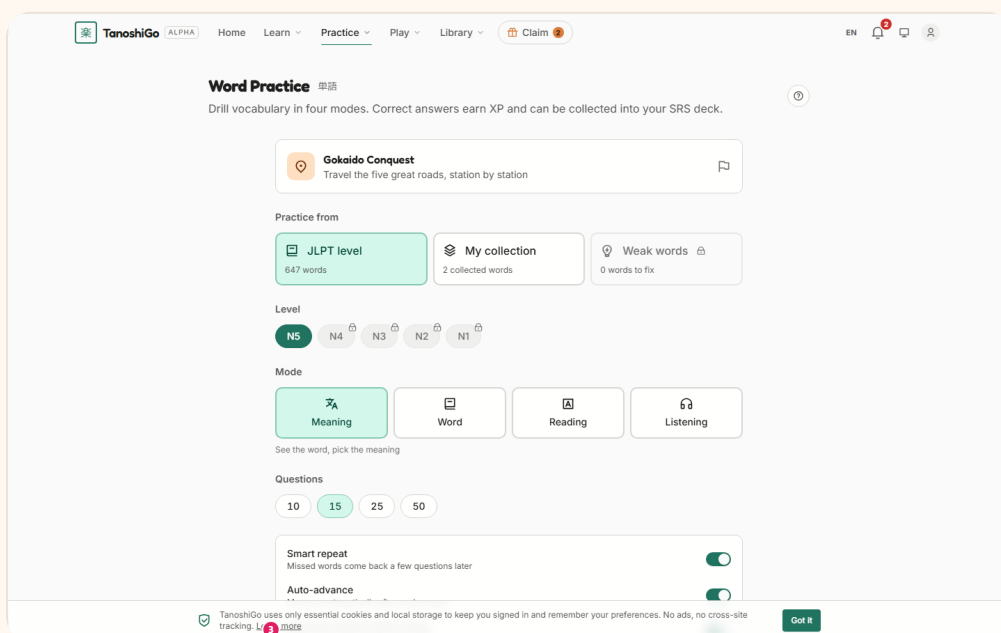

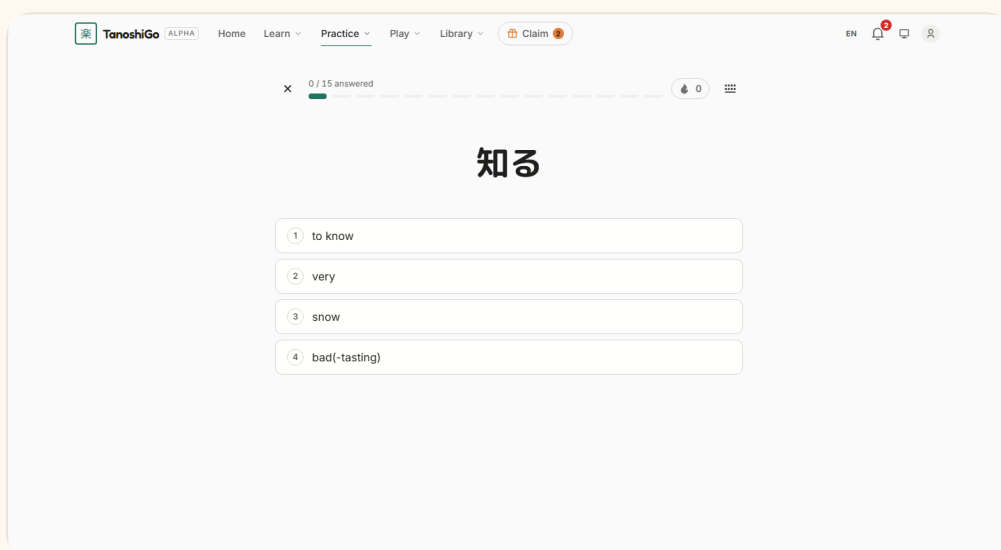
16 Word Practice drills

Quick multiple-choice drills to sharpen recall.

- 1 Open Practice then Word Practice.
- 2 Choose a source (Level, My collection, or Weak words), a mode, and how many questions.
- 3 Click Start. Answer each question with the keyboard (1-4) or by tapping.
- 4 At the end, review any missed words and add them to your collection.

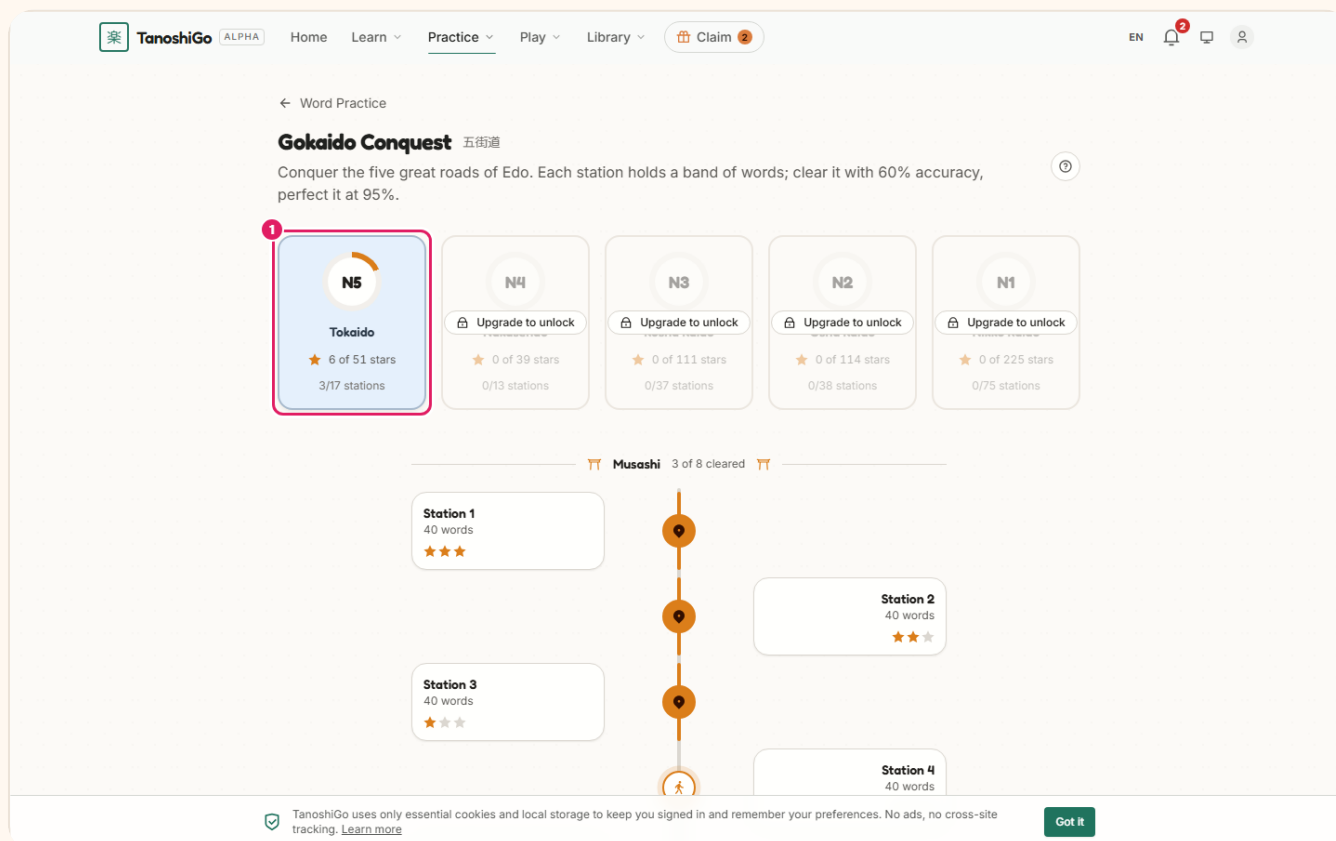

17 Gokaido Conquest

A map-based campaign through the vocabulary of each JLPT level.

- 1 Open Word Practice then Conquest, and pick a road (one per level).
- 2 Tap a station to see its star requirements, then start the drill.
- 3 Clear stations to earn stars and unlock the next one along the road.

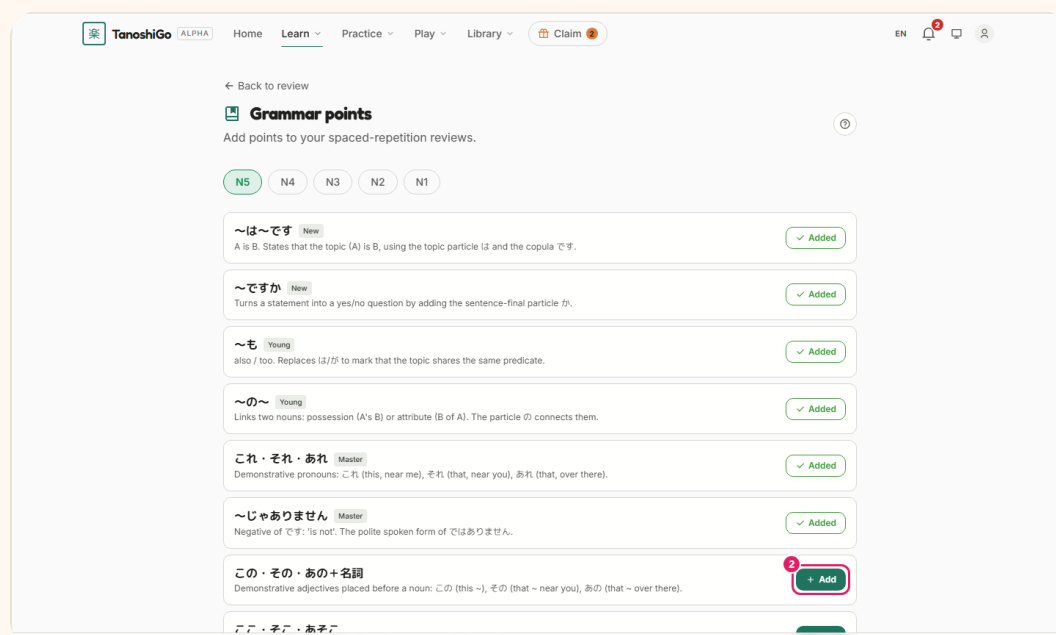

You must clear a station before the next one opens. Free accounts can only play the first region of each road.

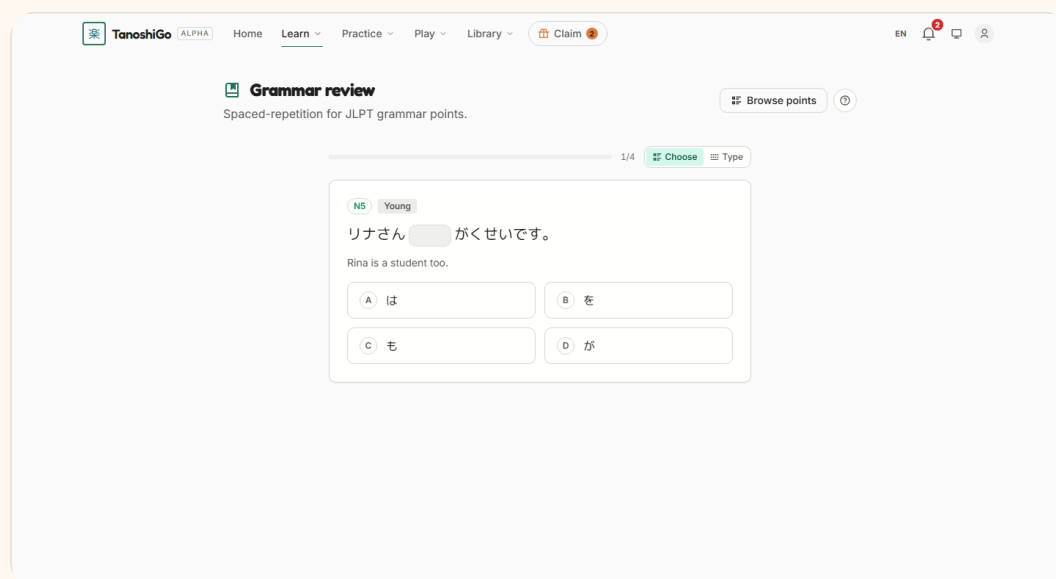
18 Grammar SRS

Review grammar patterns the same way you review vocabulary.

- 1 Open Learn then Grammar, then Browse to see patterns by level.
- 2 Click Add on any pattern to put it in your reviews.
- 3 Open Grammar review. Read the sentence or pattern, then reveal the answer.
- 4 Grade yourself: Again, Hard, Good, or Easy.

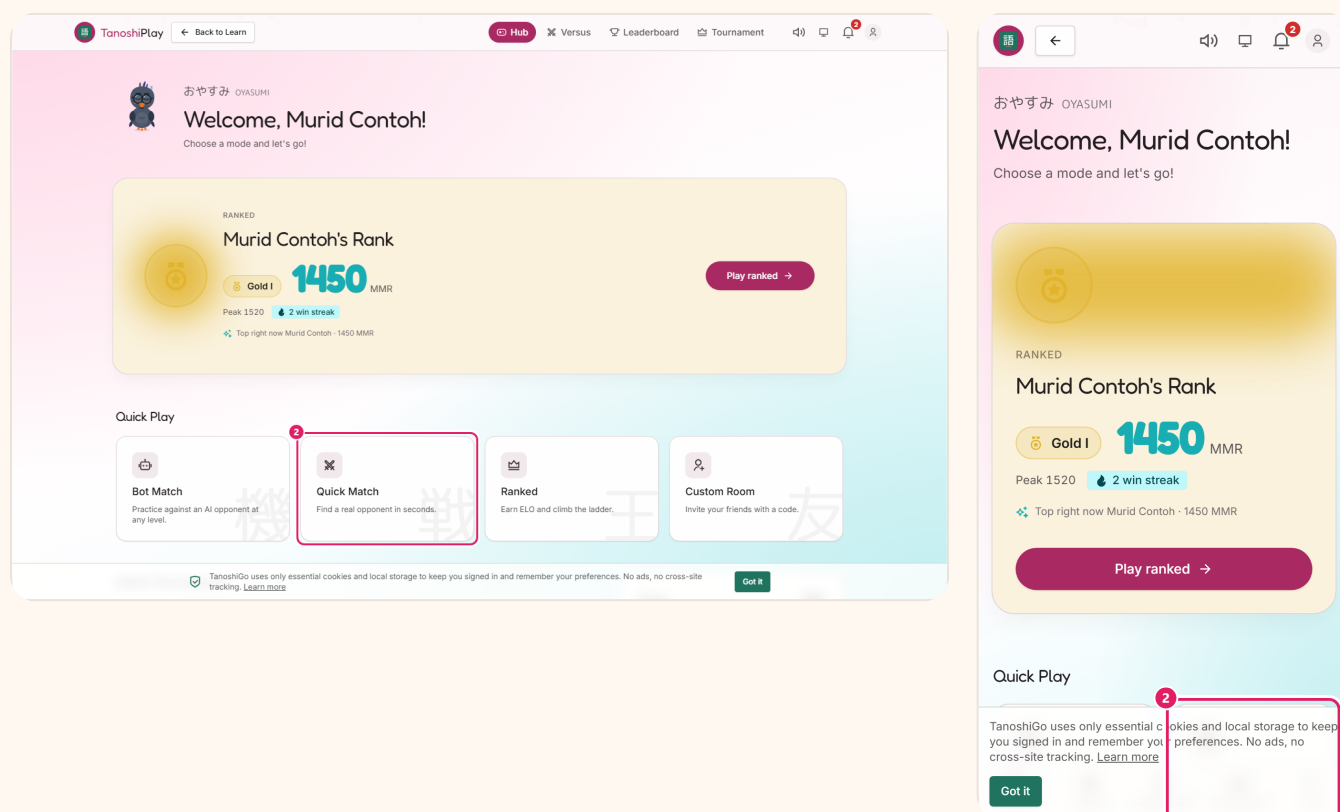


A Grammar SRS review card.

19 Versus matches

Race another player or a bot through JLPT-style questions.

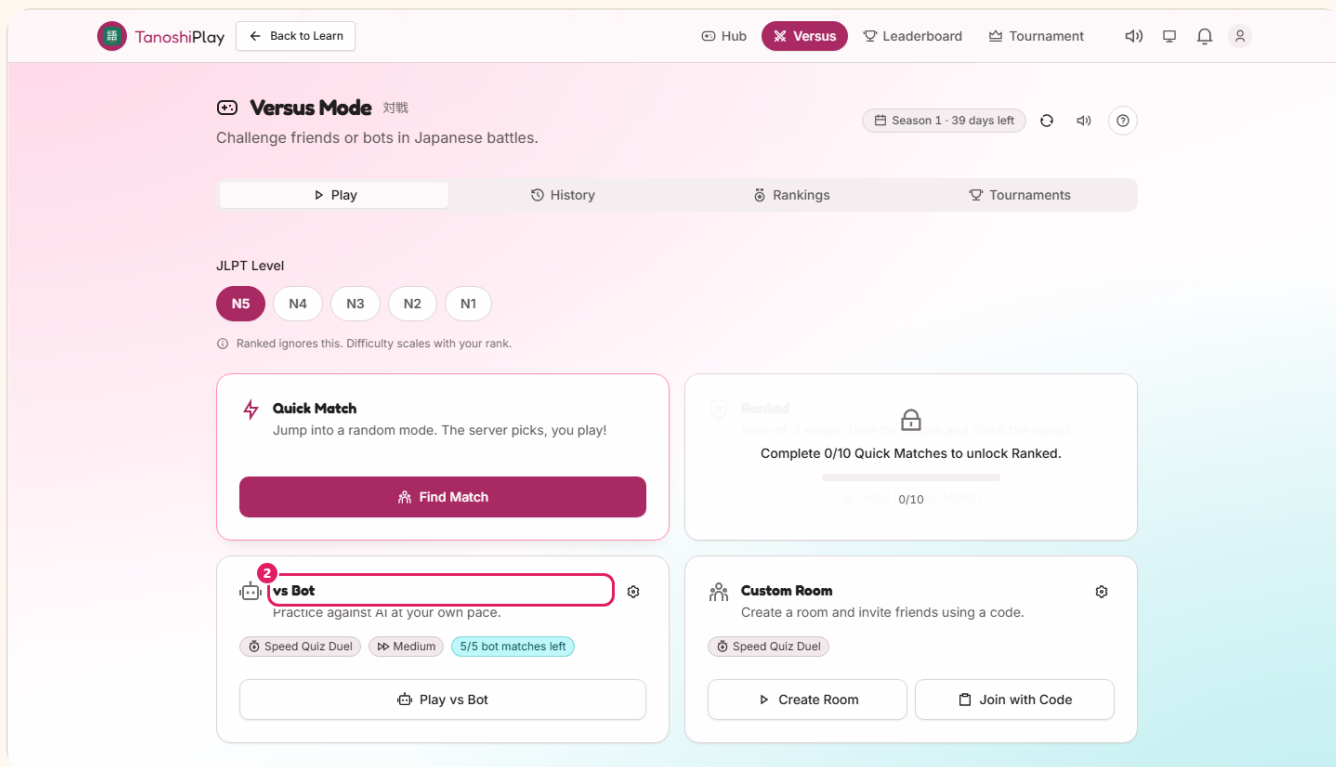
- 1 Open Play. The hero card shows your rank once you are calibrated.
- 2 Pick Bot, Quick Match, Ranked, or Custom Room.
- 3 Quick and Ranked matches queue you with another player. vs Bot starts right away.
- 4 Answer as fast and accurately as you can. The match room shows the live score.
- 5 After the match, see your result, XP, and (for ranked) your rating change.



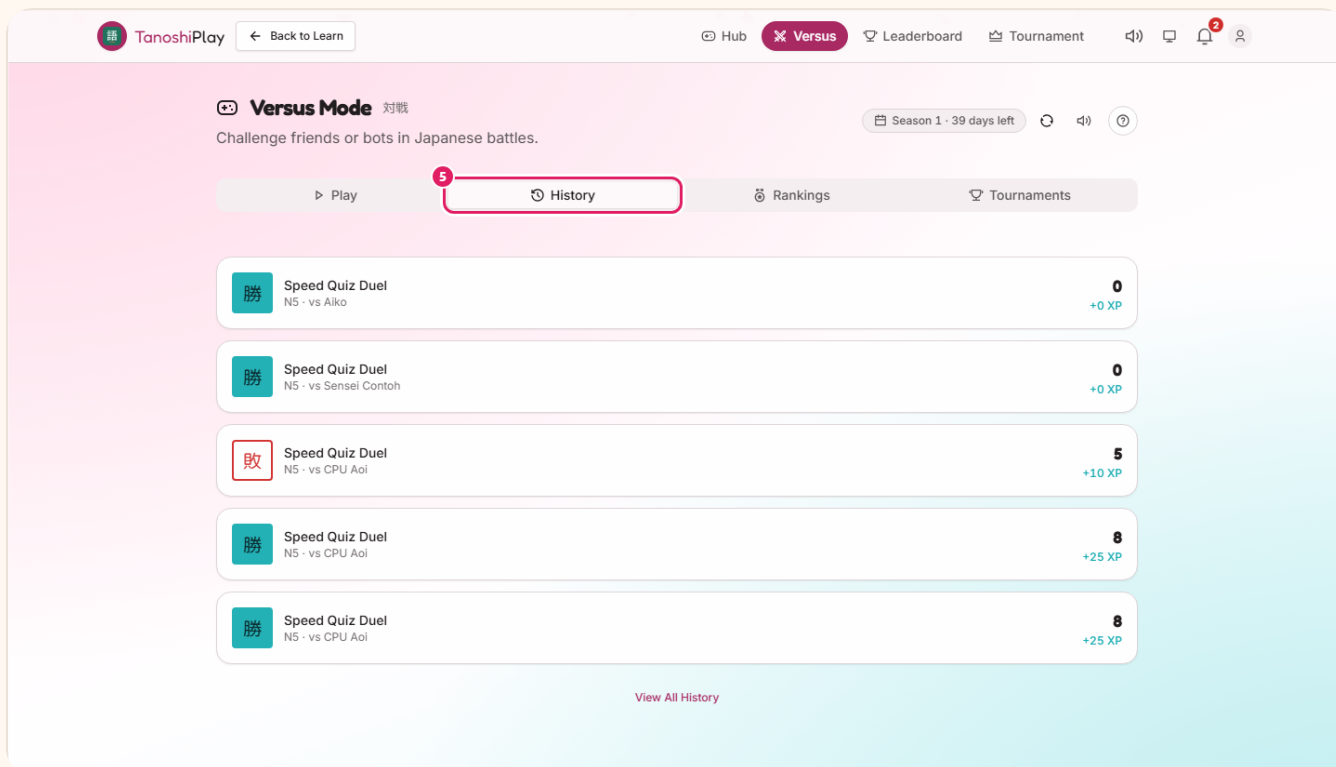
The Play Hub with your rank and quick actions.

The Ranked card before it unlocks.

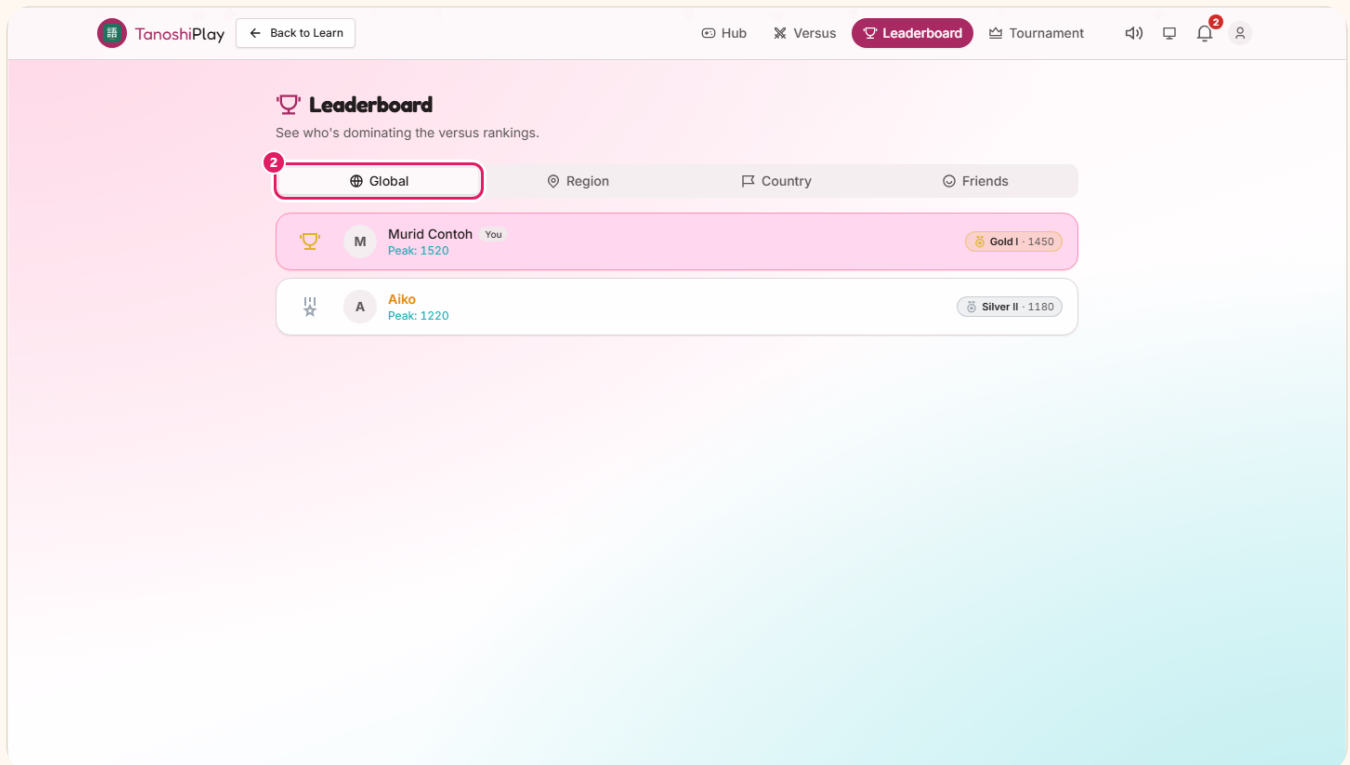

- 3 Your own row is highlighted wherever you rank.

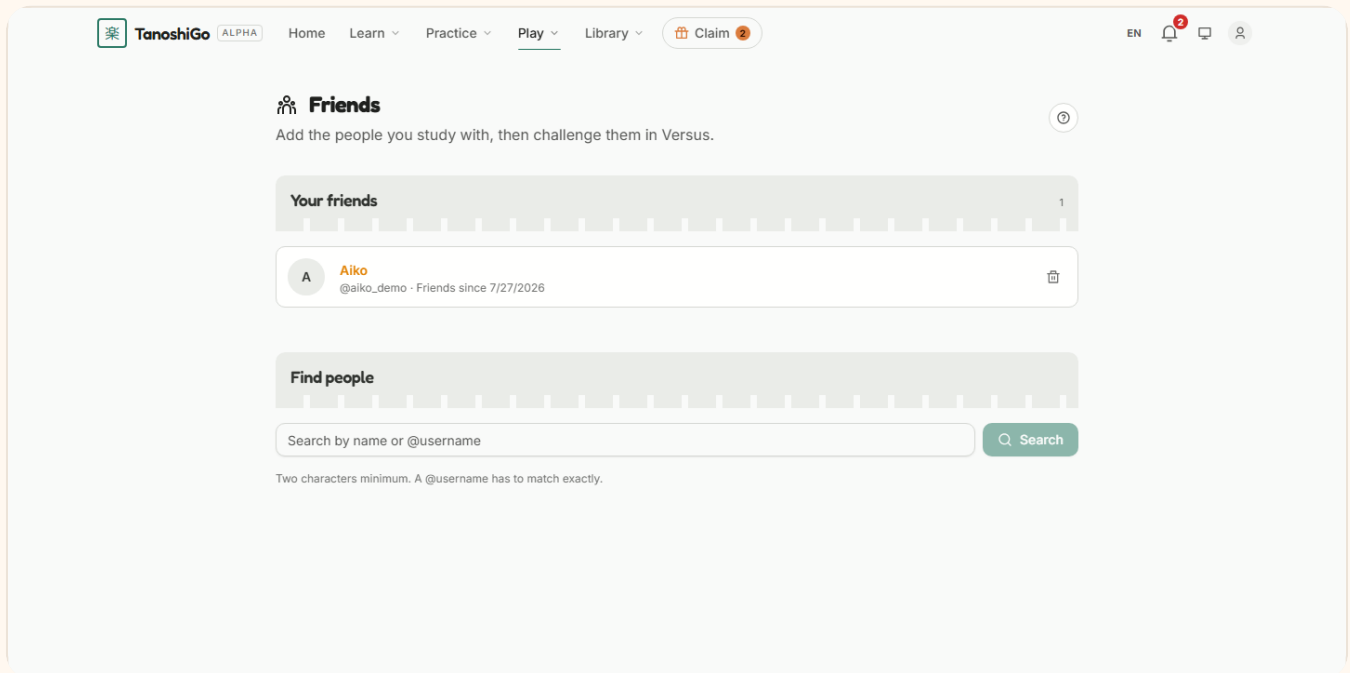


The global leaderboard.

- 3 Accept or reject incoming requests from the Requests tab.

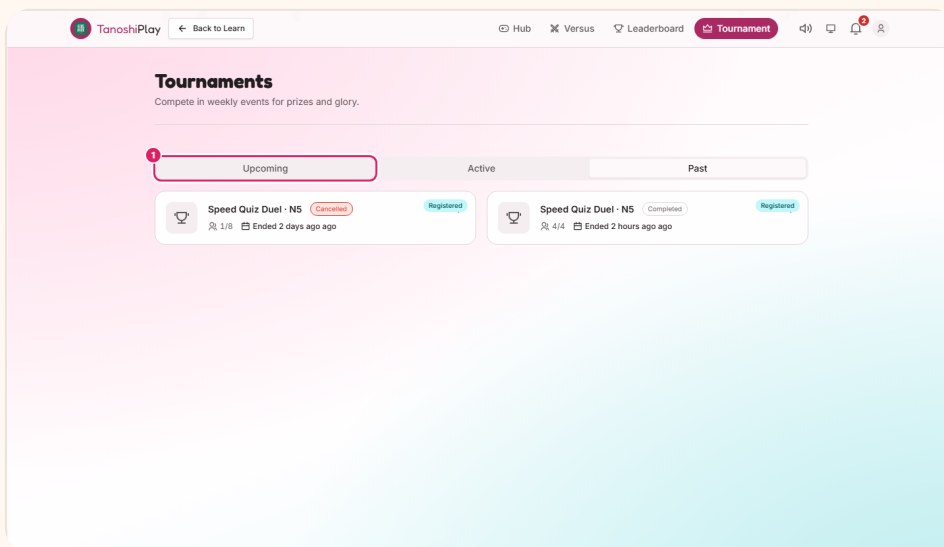

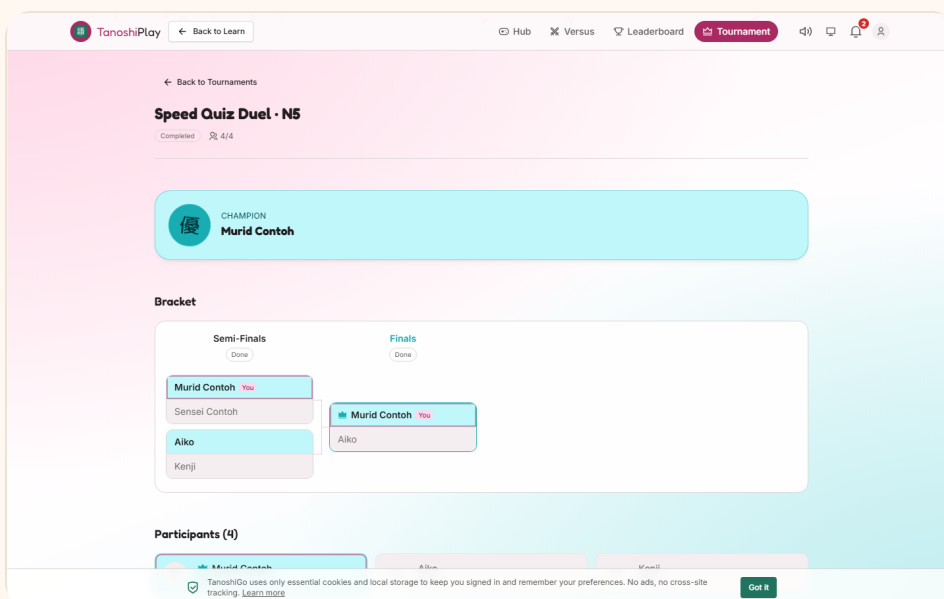
22 Tournaments
